



Tornadoes are powerful and dangerous rotating columns of air that touch the ground. They are often called twisters or whirlwinds, and they can cause a lot of damage. Tornadoes form from thunderstorms and can happen anywhere in the world, but they are most common in the central United States, known as Tornado Alley. Tornadoes can be very destructive, tearing down buildings, uprooting trees, and throwing objects through the air.

Tornadoes can be hard to see because wind is invisible. However, they often form a funnel shape made of water droplets, dust, and debris. Most tornadoes have wind speeds less than 110 miles per hour and last for only a few miles. But some tornadoes can be much stronger, with winds over 300 miles per hour and paths that stretch for miles.

Tornadoes can happen at any time of year, but they are most common in the spring and summer. They usually form near the trailing edge of a thunderstorm, and sometimes you can even see clear skies behind a tornado. It's important to be aware of the signs of a tornado, such as a sudden drop in wind speed, a dark, and rotating cloud.



If you see a tornado, it's important to take cover immediately. Go to a basement or an interior room on the lowest floor of a sturdy building.
